Mission statement

Domains of responsibility and deliverables

1. *Knowledge*

2. *Surgical skills*

Assisting Young Neurosurgeons develop their surgical skills through courses, meetings, webinars and web-based conferences tailored to the diverse needs of Young Neurosurgeons worldwide.

3. *Research capability*

Assisting Young Neurosurgeons develop their research capability through training in clinical research methodology and critical appraisal.

4. *Career development*

Assisting Young Neurosurgeons develop their careers by creating a comprehensive database of fellowships and laying the foundation for a program of mentoring.
